The picturesque ten-acre property, which serves as the Academy's campus, is the former estate of George Horace Lorimer, editor of the Saturday Evening Post. In addition to the most up-to-date instructional areas and classrooms, complete with interactive whiteboards, Apple TVs, and laptop/iPad carts, the Academy houses a full service dining room, a gymnasium, three science labs, two world language classrooms, a STEM lab, a MIDI lab, six studios for private music instruction, an art studio equipped with a kiln and a computer graphics area, a 500-seat auditorium, and fully equipped library. Our outdoor facilities are comprised of two play areas and an athletic field with a spectator area, a fitness walk, school garden, and an outdoor classroom.

Half Day (\$200/per week)

ART OF CODE 1 Grades K to 2
